Oral cancer & HPV infection



Please be advised the contents of the following paragraphs may not be appropriate reading for all. However, as certain types of oral cancer are linked to HPV (Human Papilloma Virus) infection, it is important that we are all aware of the risks, detection and prevention. Of particular relevance to us as dentists are HPV 6,11,16 and 18. In fact, HPV 16 DNA has been found in 80-90% of oropharyngeal carcinomas.

HPV is transmitted by sexual contact (including oral sex) and most people infected may not have symptoms and therefore may unknowingly pass the virus on to a sexual partner.

Prevention is by means of vaccination. The only vaccine currently available on the NHS is Cerverix®, which is available for girls over 12 and is effective against HPV 16 and 18. Vaccination has been shown to reduce the incidence of cervical cancer. Gardasil®, currently only available privately, is effective against HPV 6,11,16 and 18 and should ideally be administered to boys and girls before they first become sexually active.

How can we help? Regular dental examinations are important as many of the signs can be found at your check up. Ulcers, warts or other abnormalities of the soft tissues in your mouth can be spotted early, as can lumps in the neck and jaw area and

prompt referral to an oral surgeon can greatly improve the possibility of a good outcome.

Please book an appointment with us if you have any or all of the following symptoms: a persistent sore throat that doesn't respond to antibiotics, pain or difficulty swallowing, a lump in the back of your throat or mouth and/or neck, bleeding in your mouth or throat, voice changes with or without a persistent cough or ear pain.

It is important to remember that smoking and alcohol consumption still remain the greatest risk factors in the development of cancers of the head and neck.

Any concern you may have, however trivial you may feel it is, will be treated in complete confidence and be taken seriously.
